

## Message from Brendan O'Rourke

The Pope of Humility and Communion



When Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio of Argentina gave his first speech as Pope Francis on the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica in 2013, there was something that struck me immediately. It was a short address, and he didn't speak at length—clearly overwhelmed and humbled by what was transpiring—but after a few opening remarks he said:

"And now I would like to give the blessing, but first I want to ask you a favor. Before the Pope blesses the people, I ask that you would pray to the Lord to bless me — the prayer of the people for their Pope. Let us say this prayer — your prayer for me — in silence."

Immediately, all of St. Peter Square fell silent, along with the millions around the world watching, and we prayed for our new pope. It was a moment of profound humility and communion.

To me, this was the theme of Pope Francis's pontificate: humility and communion.

As the saying by C.S. Lewis goes, "Humility is not thinking less of yourself, it's thinking of yourself less." Practically it might mean putting our phones away more (especially when we are with other people) so that we can give them our full attention. It might also mean helping around the house, even when when we don't get anything out of it.

Pope Francis also had a profound sense of communion with all people, especially for those who don't look like us, or those who are most easily forgotten. He had an especially deep fondness for the elderly. He once said, "Attending to our grandparents and the elderly is not only a sign of gratitude and affection, but a necessity in the construction of a more human and fraternal society."

And the beautiful thing about our faith is that Pope Francis still shares that communion with us, and we with him. Just as we pray for all of the faithfully departed, we also pray for the repose of the soul of Pope Francis, that he would be welcomed in to the loving arms of Jesus.

I'll leave you with the closing words of that opening address of Pope Francis in St. Peter's Square in 2013, which, in my imagination are the words he said to us all before he went to the House of the Father:

"Brothers and sisters, I am leaving you. Thank you for your welcome. Pray for me and I will be with you again soon."

## Second Sunday of Easter Sunday of Divine Mercy

Acts 5:12-16 | Rev 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19 | Jn 20:19-31

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

On this Easter Octave, we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. As Jesus revealed to the Polish nun St. Faustina Kowalska, the blood and water that gushed forth from his side during his crucifixion would become a "fountain of mercy" for all of us. In today's first reading, we witness what happens now that the Apostles have received that mercy flowing from the foot of the cross. Motivated by the mystery of Jesus' resurrection and ascension and emboldened by the gift of the Holy Spirit, these men are now continuing his ministry of healing. Just as the ill and possessed flocked to Christ, so now those sick in body or spirit see the power of Christ working through the Apostles. The beauty of receiving God's mercy is that it doesn't stop once it's been poured into us – his mercy compels us, inspiring us to become living fonts of mercy to those we encounter.

#### GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In a somewhat confusing chronology, today's Gospel takes place in time before the events in our first reading. So we go with the disciples back to "the evening of that first day of the week." They have been through a lot over the past weeks. They have watched their community turn on Jesus and give him over to be brutally killed. They have walked with him through his agonizing passion and bitter death, and they have witnessed his glorious resurrection from the dead. "Overwhelming" seems too small a word. Can you imagine the weight of their experience on a physical, emotional, and spiritual level? Now, in today's Gospel, we see them gathered together behind locked doors, shaken from the recent events, and fearing for their own lives. Somehow, mysteriously, Jesus enters the room and says, "Peace be with you." Three times. Jesus repeats this phrase to his disciples in this reading. Untethered by space and time and in the wake of grief and glory, the Savior of the world extends himself in an intimate encounter, radically present to those who love him.

#### REFLECT

Throughout today's Scriptures, we see the Lord's relentless pursuit of the human heart. We see a God who loves us so passionately that he pours himself into us, inviting us to partake in his mission by the outpouring of his mercy and the power of his Holy Spirit. Today, pause to reflect on the mercy of God. In what areas of your life can you see God's mercy at work? How can you be an instrument of his mercy for others?





How to Obtain the Unique Plenary Indulgence Jesus Offers on Divine Mercy Sunday

- 1. Go to Confession (20 days before, on, or after Divine Mercy Sunday)
- 2. Receive Holy Communion (20 days before, on, or after Divine Mercy Sunday)
- 3. Pray for the Pope
- 4.In any church or chapel, recite an Our Father, Creed, and a prayer to the Merciful Jesus (i.e., "Merciful Jesus, I trust in You!") in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, or, participate in services honoring the Divine Mercy devotion.

One must approach the indulgence with a spirit "completely detached from the affection for a sin," both mortal and venial. The Church also allows the ill or those who cannot attend church to obtain this indulgence. One may fulfill the three usual conditions as described above as soon as possible, along with reciting an Our Father, Creed, and prayer to the Merciful Jesus.
