

Dear Members of our Parish Family:

On behalf of the Parish Finance Committee, this letter describes the financial results and statement of condition for our parish for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022. For reporting purposes, we have isolated from the table below, to the extent possible, the *For God's Glory* capital campaign from the general operations of the parish as well as the parish's participation in the government's SBA Payroll Protection Program during the Covid pandemic for the prior fiscal year. Further, as we described in last year's report, the parish is incurring substantial depreciation expense (a non-cash item) from the *For God's Glory* building project that impacts our overall financial results therefore we have broken that out in the financial results presented here.

<u>Summary</u>

Over the last few years, the Covid-era fiscal stimulus has been a "net-positive" to our parish and our parish school. For the parish we have isolated that financial impact on the financial statement. For the parish school, that is more difficult as the funding is generally "off-balance sheet" but the funding has been instrumental to providing needed staffing such as counselors and aides, as well as supplies and equipment to assist during the pandemic. Those programs all end at the end of this current fiscal year. The bottom line is the Parish is back to essentially a break-even core financial position which we will summarize below.

For the fiscal year, Total Revenue of \$2.8 million a decrease of 2.7% over the prior year. On the revenue side, education revenue was down 12% over the prior year, due primarily to decreased enrollment in the parish school. The parish school finished 2021-22 at its lowest enrollment level in many years. We are happy to report that for the current year, enrollment is up nicely thereby stabilizing the school revenue line item. Continuing a long-term trend, parish weekly offertory collections were essentially flat with bequests increasing \$25,700 over the same period last year. Activities, net revenue, reported an increase of \$112,000 due primarily to having two FunFest's during the fiscal year (Sept and June). Other revenue had a year over year decrease of \$23,400 due primarily to the lack of any "overage" returned to the parish from the Bishops Annual Appeal.

The parish's single largest expense continues to be the catholic education of our parish children. Parish education support includes our parish school, youth catechesis education, and high school secondary support. The parish's net contribution to all facets of education was \$459,700 for the 2022 fiscal year, an increase of \$169,600 or approximately 58%. The increase is partly due to reduced enrollment (the revenue side) coupled with normal increased compensation expense as well as increasing operating costs. As we mentioned above, our parish school enrollment was under pressure for 2021-22, while our pre-school operated at near capacity. "Retention and recruitment" efforts remain a focus for the School Advisory Board to assure long term viability of the school and those efforts have provided a 7% increase in enrollment for 2022-23. The Parish Finance Committee continues to work with the School Advisory Board to reduce the parish financial commitment over time to the school to a lower level more in line with the Parish Operating Budget.

Further, the parish continues to watch its own operating expenses. However, as you all are experiencing increasing household expenses, so is the parish. With the larger physical plant of the parish facilities as well as our normal operating costs, parish operating costs have increased 35% year over year.

With the construction completed on the *For God's Glory* project, as of June 30, 2022 the project loan has been paid down to \$1.23 million from pledges received since the project's inception. The remaining balance will be repaid from pledges to be received (generally over one more year) as well as from normal parish operations. However, we do expect the Parish will have outstanding debt from this project that will take some time to be extinguished. Our parish savings account sits at \$320,100 at June 30, 2022. As the parish has returned post-Covid to our historical break-even operating position, we fully expect to again utilize the parish savings account to fund increasing normal operating costs.

Our 966 registered families provide so much to this parish. St. Catharine Parish is very blessed to have so many involved and supporting families who step up when called upon, either in time, talent or treasure. We thank everyone for their financial support of our parish. We look forward to keeping you posted on our financial position and results.

What is FEASTING?

The day a Saint or sacred mystery of our Faith is celebrated is known as a Feast Day or Holy Day. Besides solemnities (usually celebrating an important event in the life of Jesus), the Catholic Church recognizes more than ten thousand Saints! The Church has many wonderful seasons of feasting and fasting on the calendar: Advent, Christmas, Lent, the Sacred Triduum, Easter, Pentecost and everything in between. There is a treasure chest of traditions to help families share the stories of our Faith and guide us all closer to Jesus. This issue of FEASTING might help you do that. May every day of November be a day to make our Faith a part of your family's everyday life.

In your family, you might also celebrate name days (feast days in the Church calendar of the Saints who share your name) and the anniversary of your baptism with a special dessert, prayers, or stories related to the day.



11/1 Solemnity of All Saints

This is the day to celebrate holiness! Did you know that *everyone* in Heaven is a Saint? All Saints Day is a holy day of opportunity the Church reminds us to slow down, go to Mass, and consider how we can help get our family to Heaven. If you have little ones, consider taking them to Little Saints at St. Catharine at 10:00am. Let your children dress up as their favorite Saint for dinner, using things you already have around your house. Read a few stories from a book about the Saints or do a quick online search for information about patron Saints who may connect with your family.

11/2 All Souls Day

Today we pray for the faithful souls in purgatory, those being prepared to enter the Holy Presence of God. Take time to pray for the holy souls, especially those of your loved ones. At church or at home light a candle offer a prayer for them. Share stories of loved ones who have passed away with your children.



11/3 St. Martin de Porres

St. Martin was a Dominican brother from Peru who lived a life of humble service and became the first black Saint of the Americas. Today is a good day to care for pets - he is often pictured with cats, dogs, and mice. Learn one of the miraculous stories about him to celebrate the day.

11/11 St. Martin of Tours

St. Martin of Tours was a soldier and bishop. Today, pray with your family for everyone who has served in the military. Read the story of St. Martin and the beggar who received his cloak. It might be fun to clean out your coat closet and donate what you don't need to honor St. Martin today.

11/26 Catholic New Year's Eve!

The first Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of a new year in the Church. Celebrate the New Year with a special meal, and maybe even a countdown (try 7:00pm with little ones rather than midnight!), and allow everyone to choose their own patron Saint for the year. On Sunday, don't forget to wish Fr. Morris a happy new year! ;)

Month of the Holy Souls

One of the Spiritual Works of Mercy is to pray for the living and the dead. November is a great time to teach your children to pray for those who cannot pray for themselves because the entire month is dedicated to the Holy Souls in purgatory. Visit a local Catholic cemetery (Resurrection in Lewis Center, St. Joseph in Lockbourne, Mt. Calvary in Columbus, and Holy Cross in Pataskala) and pray for the dead by name. One prayer to learn is the prayer for eternal rest:
