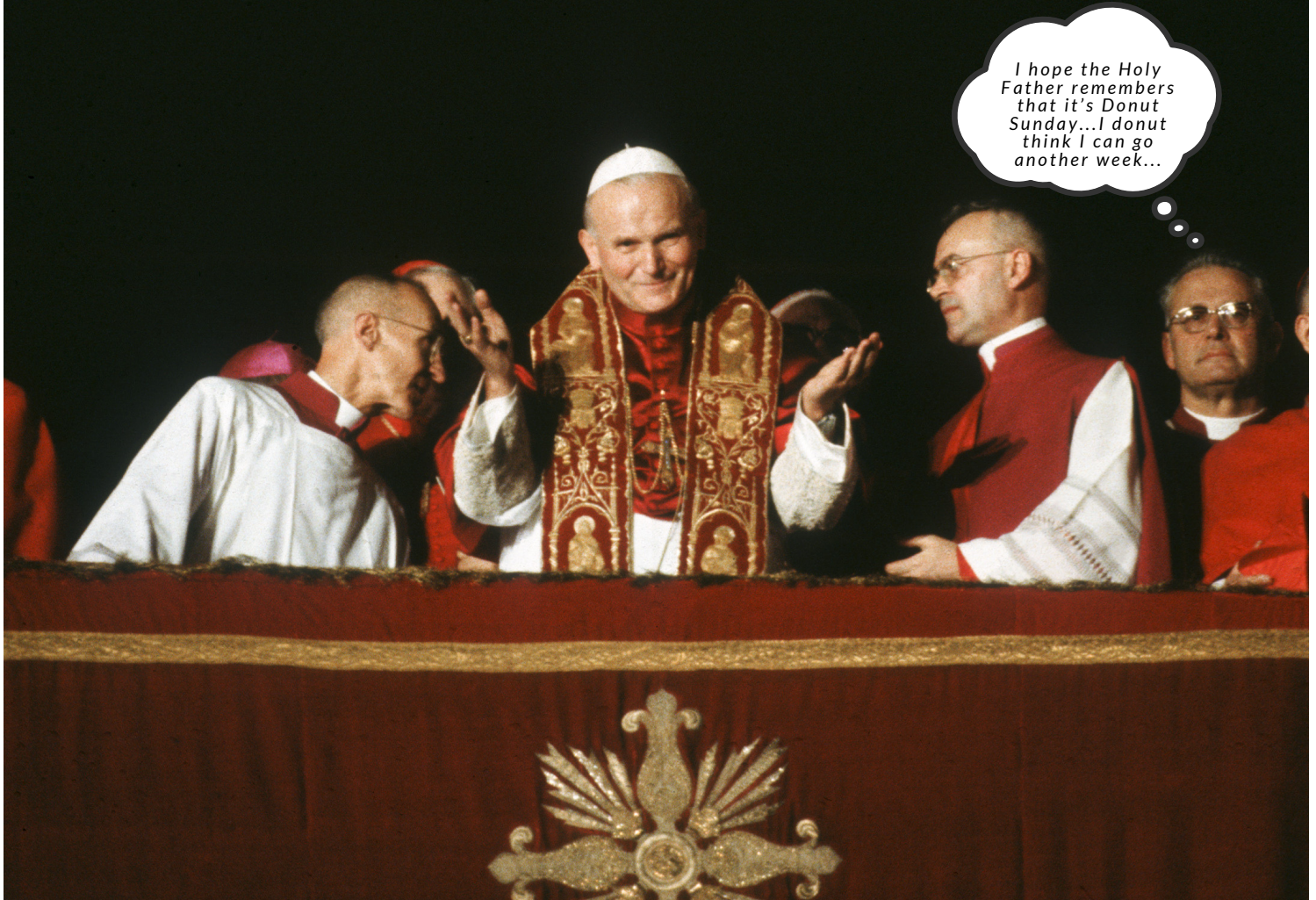

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MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS

Embrace. Welcome. Participate.

All people are created in the image of God; their dignity and worth cannot be diminished by mental illness.

As Catholics, we are called to embrace an ever-clearer vision of each human person as created by God with inherent dignity and worth. This truth is not diminished when someone struggles with various illnesses or behaviors, including mental health concerns. Pope St. John Paul II reminded us of this fundamental truth in 1996 at the International Conference for Health Care Workers:

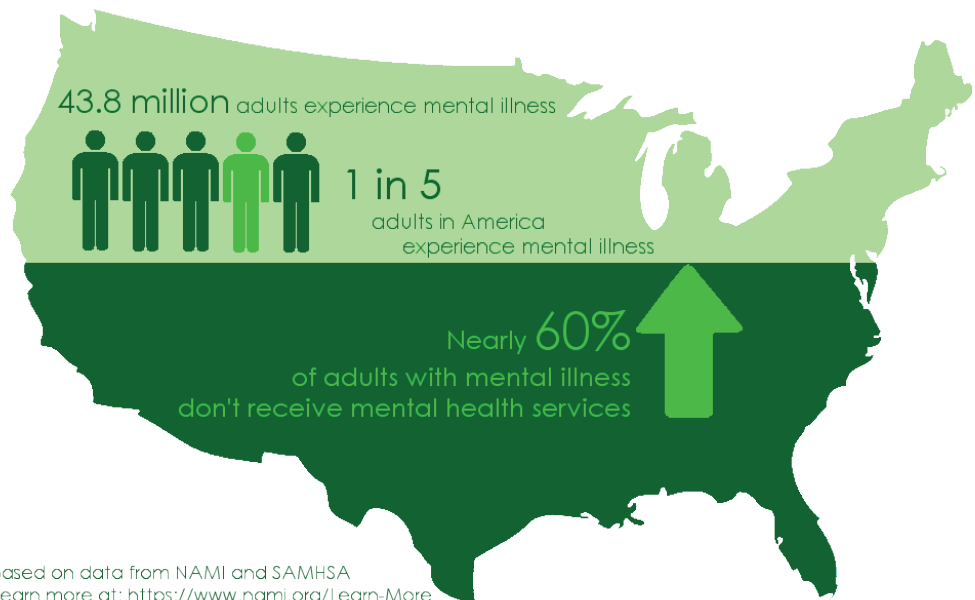
“Whoever suffers from mental illness always bears God’s image and likeness in themselves, as does every human being. In addition, they always have the inalienable right not only to be considered as an image of God and therefore as a person, but also to be treated as such.”

Mental health includes our emotional, psychological and social well-being. It affects how we think and act and helps determine how we handle stress, relate to others, and make choices (Mentalhealth.gov). When a person suffers from mental illness, it can interfere with their everyday life and can result in an inability to cope with life’s ordinary demands and routines (NCPD).

Mental illness, as with any health-related issue, can vary in severity and look very different from person to person. Oftentimes, we may not observe the warning signs that someone is struggling with their mental health. This does not mean that the warning

signs are not there, or that the problem is insignificant and should be ignored. Unfortunately, there is also stigma attached to mental illness which may lead people who are struggling to isolate themselves, choosing not to share that they are hurting, and not seek help or treatment.

As a faith community, we are called to support our brothers and sisters suffering from a mental health condition, offering the unconditional and non-judgmental love they deserve. Rather than accept the misconceptions surrounding mental illness, we can increase our awareness of its symptoms and effects, and identify the local resources. Moreover, we must be in relationship with



others, bringing hope and comfort in times of crisis or pain by offering prayers of healing and accompaniment through treatment. Together, the parish can be a place of healing for all people and their families!

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

Personal: How would I react if I found out a close friend or family member has been diagnosed with a mental health condition? How has the media shaped my image of mental illness? What can I do to reduce the stigma?

Family: How do we as a family care for the mental health of each family member? How can we inform and assist our parish to respond to our needs and/or the needs of families struggling with mental health?

Parish: Are we aware of the barriers that people with a mental health condition and their families experience in our parish? How can we make our parish a safe space for all families? How do we ensure our parish is welcoming and inviting all people into a deeper relationship with God - not only into participation but also in leadership?

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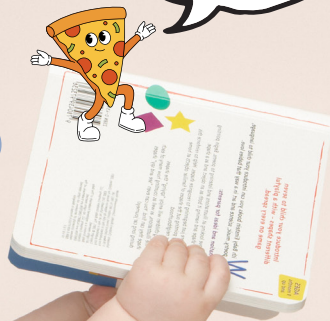

Ex 17:8-13 | 2 Tim 3:14—4:2 | Luke 18:1-8

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GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Studying Scripture is not a side dish on the plate of practicing the faith. It is an essential component of the virtuous life, and without it, our faith will surely falter. In his second letter to Timothy, Saint Paul reminds us that the Scriptures are the inspired Word of God and they train us in righteous living and equip us for every good work. There will undoubtedly be times when we feel ill-equipped – when we are fatigued, frustrated, or concerned. It is precisely in these moments that we're invited to go quickly to the holy Word of God! Read it, pray with it, and invite the Spirit to speak to you through it. There you will find the wisdom needed to face every circumstance.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Our faith journey was never meant to be a solitary endeavor! We see this in today's first reading when Aaron and Hur stand beside Moses, holding his weary arms in the air as the battle rages on against the Amalekites. This image of the three men on the mountain – Moses with his arms raised high, Aaron and Hur on either side supporting them – is a powerful image of companionship in the Christian life. When you feel too weary to pray, look around – the Lord has likely given you companions who can support you precisely in the ways you need at this time. Pay attention, too, to who God might be inviting you to support in prayer. Our Gospel tells us that God always hears our prayer and calls us to be persistent in prayer. Certainly, God will "secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night." God calls us to persist in prayer because it reveals our faith and trust in him that we constantly bring our needs before him.

REFLECT

Our readings offer helpful tools to turn to when discouragement or isolation may cloud our spiritual vision. Take some time this week to listen to the Lord's voice in Scripture. Or, if you're feeling weary, ask a few friends to pray with and for you. Remember that although God may seem distant, he always hears us. Be persistent in bringing your needs to him and wait with patience – surely, he will come swiftly to your aid.

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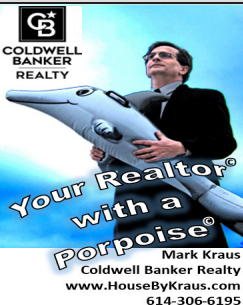

Missionaries for Life!

There is a real change in the weather. The Fall chill is in the air and there is a notable increase in evening and early morning darkness. We put on an extra layer of clothing and seek out more morning and afternoon light.



Last Friday I preached a homily about our hearts—particularly about guarding our hearts, how to live in the light. I spoke about the opposition Jesus faced even in the face of His healing miracles. Conversion of our hearts are needed; a divided heart cannot stand.

Today in our world the teachings of Jesus are seen as evil. Jesus' teachings have actually been branded as hate speech. This is particularly noted in the public square on the Church's teachings on the sanctity of all human life.

We read of the threat of proclaiming the Gospel of Life; Jesus calls for courage and boldness. They prayed in response to persecution and threats (Acts 4:29-31) saying, "And now Lord take note of their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with all boldness, while you stretch out your hand to heal, and signs and wonders are done through the name of your holy servant Jesus. And when they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God with boldness."

How do we fill our hearts with courage and boldness? INVITE the LORD to Come! Come Holy Spirit! He might shake you!

First off, we fill our hearts with His love. We seek union with God—where light displaces the darkness. Maybe we take a Holy Hour, adore God and contemplate His WORD. Receive the Eucharist. Repent and believe.

St. Bonaventure said, "The Holy Spirit comes where He is loved, where He is invited, where He is expected."

My friends, an empty heart is dangerous! The best way for us to avoid evil is to fill ourselves with God's presence. PRAY! Invite Him, expect Him! Pray, saying "Fill me King Jesus with more love, fill me King Jesus with more joy (the joy of the Lord is my strength) and fill me with your power - your authority King Jesus!"

Friends, in a world obsessed with fear and distracted by darkness, we can seek deliverance by filling our hearts with the victory of the cross. Return to the simplicity of union with God, where light displaces the darkness.

Human Trafficking

A Catholic Response

Pray • Learn • Act

Human trafficking is a modern-day form of slavery. Victims of human trafficking are subjected to force, fraud, or coercion, for the purpose of sexual exploitation or forced labor. Trafficking in persons **inherently rejects the dignity of the human person** and exploits conditions of global poverty.

St. Josephine Bakhita
1869–1947, Sudan

Patron Saint of Human Trafficking Survivors

St. Josephine was kidnapped as a child, enduring years of slavery. Freed in Italy, she converted to Christianity and became a Canossian Sister, dedicating her life to prayer, teaching, and helping the poor. Canonized in 2000, her feast day is February 8th.



*"I have always been distressed at the lot of those who are victims of various kinds of human trafficking. How I wish that all of us would hear God's cry: 'Where is your brother?' (Gen 4:9). Where is the brother and sister whom you are killing each day in clandestine warehouses, in rings of prostitution, in children used for begging, in exploiting undocumented labour? **Let us not look the other way. The issue involves everyone!**"*

Around the world, **158 million children between 5 and 17 years of age are involved in child labor**, working instead of learning.

According to the U.S. Bureau of International Labor Affairs, that equates to approximately 1 in 10 children tasked with working in a wide range of industries, much of which is hazardous or back breaking.

Nearly 25 million children, women, and men in the United States and throughout the world are compelled into commercial sex or labor— in brothels, salons, as agricultural workers, fishers, beggars, or janitorial staff, in situations of domestic servitude, and more.

During Vatican II, the Catholic Church reaffirmed its historic concern about forced labor, stating that "slavery, prostitution, the selling of women and children, [and] disgraceful working conditions where [people] are treated as mere tools for profit, rather than as free and responsible persons" are "infamies" and "an affront to fundamental values. . . values rooted in the very nature of the human person."
