



Paws and Reflect: Entering the Paschal Mystery

It's Bentley again—your loyal parish pup, paws-itively excited that Palm Sunday is here! You might be waving palms today, but I'm wagging my tail because we're stepping into the most sacred, meaningful week of the whole year: Holy Week.

These days ahead—the Triduum—aren't just "nice liturgies" or extra things to squeeze in around a busy schedule. They are the very heart of what it means to be Christian and to follow Jesus. This week, we remember and enter into the Paschal Mystery: Jesus' Passion, Death, and Resurrection.



Now, I know that's a big theological phrase
—"Paschal Mystery." But here's how I
understand it (dog terms, of course): it's the

mystery of how love, real love, goes all the way. Jesus didn't hold anything back. He washed feet. He broke bread. He prayed in agony. He carried the Cross. He suffered and died. And then—just when all seemed lost—He rose from the dead and changed everything. That's not just something He did back then. That's something He does for us, right now.

The Triduum begins on Holy Thursday, with the beautiful **Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7:00pm**. It's not just a remembrance—it's a representation of Jesus giving Himself to us in the Eucharist, instituting the priesthood, and teaching us what it means to serve with love. On Good Friday, we sit at the foot of the Cross with the **Liturgy of the Lord's Passion at 3:00pm**. It's heavy. It's solemn. But it's also full of hope, because it shows us a God who's not afraid of suffering—who enters into ours, and redeems it.

And following the great silence of Holy Saturday is the **Easter Vigil on Saturday night at 9:00pm** And oh—if you've never been, I have one word for you: go. The light breaking into darkness, the music, the new fire, the alleluias, the baptisms—it's the Church at her most joyful and radiant. It's not just the beginning of Easter; it's the beginning of everything.

And of course, **Easter Sunday Mass at 8:30am and 11:00am** is the great celebration of Jesus' Resurrection—hope that can never be undone! The joy in the church is contagious (even for a dog), and it's not just about tulips and ham dinners (though I'm not opposed to leftovers). It's about the truth that love has the final word. Always.

I really want to encourage you to make space for these holy days. Treat them differently. Rearrange plans if you can. Come and be present. Let the story soak in. You'll never regret it.

Since I've moved into my new home over here on the east side I've noticed how seriously our Jewish neighbors prepare for and celebrate their holy days. They clear their calendars, gather their families, and honor the sacred with such care and reverence. It's beautiful—and it inspires me to be more intentional, too. We have something incredible in our faith. Let's not miss the chance to be changed by it—to be changed by Him!





Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Is 50:4-7 | Phil 2:6-11 | Lk 22:14-23:56

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

More than any other time of year, we are able to follow the actual events of Jesus' life this week according to the sequence in which they occurred. Today's procession with palms honors his entry into Jerusalem, where he would prepare to celebrate the Passover with his disciples. We can imagine Jesus spending the subsequent days preaching in the Temple and the nights conversing with his Father in prayer. Then, on Thursday, the Mass of the Lord's Supper will inaugurate the Triduum, the time which commemorates Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection. The Church places these events before our eyes each year as an invitation to enter as fully as possible into Jesus' mind and heart during Holy Week. Even if we regret not being more faithful to the goals we established at the beginning of Lent, we can still seize the opportunity of this week to accompany Jesus as he prepares to die for love of us.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

The crowds of followers who welcomed Jesus into Jerusalem triumphantly today will be silent by Friday. Among his closest disciples, all will fall asleep during his prayer of agony on the Mount of Olives. Peter himself, who says on Holy Thursday, "I am prepared to go to prison and to die with you," will deny three times that he knew Jesus. The chief priests and scribes (who, one would think, should have recognized the Messiah) will deliver him to Pilate to be crucified. In each of these examples, love for Jesus (or, in the case of the priests and scribes, fidelity to God) is tested and found wanting during Holy Week. Of course, we know that Jesus still proceeded to die so that salvation would be available to all of these people. He likewise made it possible for every future generation - including our own - to return to him in moments when we find our own love wanting. We do this by turning away from sin and seeking his forgiveness, especially in the sacrament of confession. Therefore, let us, who have acclaimed Jesus as king today, keep him as king of our hearts - not only this week, but every day of our lives.

WORSHIP

Rich in solemnity and symbolism, the Triduum liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday allow us to accompany Jesus during these difficult days and express to him our love. Try to attend as many of these liturgies as your schedule allows and enter fully into Jesus' experience of Holy Week this year.



How to Obtain the Unique Plenary Indulgence Jesus Offers on Divine Mercy Sunday

- 1. Go to Confession (20 days before, on, or after Divine Mercy Sunday)
- 2. Receive Holy Communion (20 days before, on, or after Divine Mercy Sunday)
- 3. Pray for the Pope
- 4. In any church or chapel, recite an Our Father, Creed, and a prayer to the Merciful Jesus (i.e., "Merciful Jesus, I trust in You!") in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, or, participate in services honoring the Divine Mercy devotion.

One must approach the indulgence with a spirit "completely detached from the affection for a sin," both mortal and venial. The Church also allows the ill or those who cannot attend church to obtain this indulgence. One may fulfill the three usual conditions as described above as soon as possible, along with reciting an Our Father, Creed, and prayer to the Merciful Jesus.

THE SACRED PASCHAL TRIDUUM
