

From The Principal's Desk

Saint Joseph: Provider, a Presider, and a Protector

The month of March brings so many prayerful opportunities and liturgical significance in our Church. March is also a wonderful month to honor and celebrate the saints. This starts and ends with two very important figures, both spiritually and historically in the Western Hemisphere, with Saint Katherine Drexel and Saint Oscar Romero, both of whom showed an extraordinary amount of humility and fought for justice for marginalized populations.

Saint Patrick's Day may be the most secularly commercialized memorial in our Church, aside from maybe Saint Valentine's Day. Saint Patrick, however, provides a glimpse into what real faith can endure, and the lessons that he taught us are generational.

Arguably the greatest male saint in our faith is Saint Joseph, who is my patron and Confirmation saint. Saint Joseph is much more than a Saint for Husbands, Fathers, and Workers. Saint Joseph is a model for all of us, especially for our students.

There are three characteristics that Saint Joseph represents for all of us. **Saint Joseph is a Provider, a Presider, and a Protector**. We want our students to become more like St. Joseph, particularly in these three areas.



Provider

St. Joseph provided for the Holy Family and they depended on him, accepting the responsibility of the Son of God and the Mother of God was a righteous endeavor. Providing not only stability, but also a path to safety, Saint Joseph provided an opportunity for Jesus to grow up as fully human, knowing he was also fully God. There may be no better example of humility.

We ask our students to have a direct impact on the environment they help create at our school. By being "the thermostat and not just a thermometer" they can have a positive effect on our school culture with their empathy, kindness, and compassion. As disciples, they should be invested in making others feel they belong, while still being their authentic selves. The opposite of belonging is fitting in. We don't need to be someone we are not in order to earn the approval of others.

Preside

St. Joseph led the Holy Family, just as his example leads us to Christ today. We cannot develop leaders unless we allow them to lead. Students must first learn to lead themselves. We consistently remind our students that they are responsible for their own words and actions. Accountability must start with self-accountability.

It's important for our school to establish standards and have high expectations for our students. When students have high expectations for themselves, combined with the support of others, they can achieve at a very high level.

Protecto

St. Joseph protected the Holy Family with his life. He was able to protect him because of his faith, humility, and righteousness. We have an obligation to our students to not only protect them from physical and emotional harm, but more importantly, to give them the skills to protect themselves and others. Our students are encouraged to take ownership in the physical and emotional safety of their classmates.

What if students were measured by how safe others feel in their presence? That is a question we often ask our students and ourselves. We want St. Catharine to be a safe place, with an abundance of trusted adults in each student's life. This goes beyond the immediate environment, but also emanates in our absence from our peer groups. When students are navigating their social horizons, we often remind them to surround themselves with friends who will defend them in rooms they aren't in.


We want students to carry their crosses without burdening others. If anything, we want our students to be servant-leaders, empathetic to the crosses others carry, without judging how they carry it. That, in turn, may be the most significant thing we can learn from Saint Joseph.

Third Sunday of Lent

Ex 3:1-8a, 13-15 | 1 Cor 10:1-6, 10-12 | Lk 13:1-9

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Meaningful human relationships rarely last if only one party makes an effort to maintain a connection. The same is true in our relationship with God. In the scene recorded in today's first reading - arguably one of human history's "Top Ten" most important events - God takes the initiative, but the encounter is two-sided. God causes the bush to burn and Moses approaches; God calls Moses and he responds, "Here I am!"; finally, Moses asks God his name and God reveals himself as "I am who am." Moses' cooperation with God throughout is essential for them to arrive at this monumental revelation which would allow Moses (and, by extension, all of the Israelites) to call upon God by name. Despite our many technological achievements, a free, generous, loving response to God's initiative is still the only "fruit" we can bear for him that he cannot procure himself. This is the fruit which the fig tree in Jesus' Gospel parable is meant to produce. If we truly desire and seek this relationship, God will reveal himself to us so that, no matter our stage or state of life, we can bear this fruit even now.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In his encounter with God, Moses exhibits an exemplary combination of boldness and humility which teaches us how we should approach our relationship with God. This is our "roadmap" which will help us fertilize the "ground" of our hearts. Consider Moses' bold, inquisitive spirit: "I must go over to look at this remarkable sight," and his prompt response to God's call: "Here I am!" Consider the audacity Moses must have had to ask God for his name. At the same time, however, consider his humility in removing the sandals from his feet and hiding his face before the majesty of God. The God who revealed himself to Moses is the same God who invites us into relationship with him. We can and should have Moses' boldness to ask God to teach us about himself. But we should also approach God with a spirit of reverence and awe. Our humility will be the fertile soil that God can use to make us his intimate friends and his representatives before others.

LISTEN

Sometimes we have habits or attitudes that prevent us from hearing God's voice. Like Moses removing his sandals, choose something you can forgo this week (for example, social media or music in the car) so that you can hear and respond to the Lord. Make sure you dedicate your extra quiet time to talking to God.
