

Dignity of Life Threatened in Ohio

A Catholic perspective on the proposed constitutional amendment to expand and enshrine abortion in our state.

WHAT IS HAPPENING?

A proposed amendment to Ohio's Constitution claims to recognize reproductive freedoms, but it furthers a culture of death and removes current safeguards for women. As Catholics, we find the proposed amendment dangerous, unjust, and contrary to our belief in the sacredness of all life.

WHAT CAN I DO NOW?

Groups are currently collecting citizen signatures to add the amendment to the November 2023 ballot. More informational resources are coming, but in the meantime:

Where Does the Amendment Say That?

PUTS WOMEN AT RISK

- Vague language would challenge any attempt to regulate who could perform an abortion and the standards of care required
- Could eliminate current safety standards, such as the presence of a licensed physician and assurance of hospital access in an emergency

The State shall not... interfere with...an individual's [abortion]... unless the State demonstrates that it is using the least restrictive means

ENDANGERS PREBORN CHILDREN

- Would force Ohio to abandon protections enacted for preborn children with a detectable heartbeat
- Permits abortions at any time in pregnancy; a clinician could justify a woman's anxiety or depression as a reason for late-term abortion

...in no case may such an abortion be prohibited if in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician it is necessary to protect the pregnant patient's life or health

ENABLES THOSE WHO PRESSURE WOMEN INTO ABORTIONS

- Majority of women who have had an abortion report "high levels of pressure" to seek the abortion+
- Anyone who transports, counsels, or pressures a woman into an abortion, including abusers, traffickers, and negligent clinicians, would be protected by law
- Parents would no longer need to give consent or even be informed if their minor is seeking an abortion, removing their ability to report suspected abuse of their daughter

The State shall not... penalize, prohibit, interfere with, or discriminate against... A person or entity that assists an individual [to get an abortion]





Le Brun: The Resurrection of Jesus Christ

Happy Easter, Easter People! Alleluia is Our Song!

He is risen! He is risen indeed! Eastertide lasts from the Resurrection of Our Lord until Pentecost, so keep celebrating that Good News with your family. Have you tried praying the Stations of Light yet? It is the Easter counterpart to the Lenten Stations of the Cross devotion. Every station is something that happened between Easter and Pentecost, and they are a wonderful way to focus on the risen Christ during the Easter season.

How many ways can you think of to keep the Easter celebration going until Pentecost? On May 19, begin a family novena leading up to Pentecost - sign up for reminders at praymorenovenas.com. The feast of the Ascension is the perfect day for kids to help make dessert - blue jell-o with whipped cream "clouds," of course. On Pentecost, don't miss the excitement at the St. C 11:00am Mass. Celebrate the day with a birthday cake for the Church i, a bonfire, and a family reading of the Pentecost story in Acts 2.

May is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary

Mary is the Queen of May and it is traditional to honor her in a special way this month. If you have a statue of Mary, consider having a May Crowning at home (loosely twist some flexible wire around itself three times to form a crown, leaving openings to weave flowers in between the wires). You could also add picture of Our Lady to your prayer table and let your children decorate it for



her with flowers from the yard, candles, hand drawn pictures, even streamers or balloons - whatever they think is special. We can never love Mary more than Jesus did, and it is so important to allow children



to develop a special relationship with her. Make time for a family pilgrimage to honor our Blessed Mother in the grotto at St. Catharine this month. We will add small gifts to the blue box in the

grotto to make your visit extra special - please help yourself. Consider planting a Mary Garden, featuring an outdoor statue of Mary with flowers and herbs.

May 13, Feast of Our Lady of Fatima

On May 13, 1917, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to three young peasant children in Fatima, Portugal. A "lady all in white, more brilliant than the sun... indescribably beautiful" appeared to the children who were tending their family's sheep. Our Lady asked the children at Fatima to pray the rosary, so it's



most important to pray a rosary together today.

This is also a great day for a rosary procession. In Columbus, a procession will begin at Holy Family Church at 7pm. It will proceed through downtown, passing St. Joseph Cathedral, ending at St. Patrick Church with Benediction. Shuttles will rotate (beginning at 6pm) from church to church to get everyone to their cars. Worried about the long walk with little ones? The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed at St. Patrick until Benediction, so you could visit Jesus and then watch for the procession to arrive! In previous years 700-1,000 people have gathered to ask Our Lady's intercession and pray for peace. How exciting!
