

### Message from Rachel Green

Annunciation: A Place of Encounter and Hope

The recent events at Annunciation Church in Minneapolis hit very close to home. That very church is where I first realized that Jesus was truly present in the Eucharist. It was in those pews that:



- the Good Shepherd would lead me almost every morning on my way to work
- I began my conversion to Catholicism over 10 years ago
- I stumbled upon my first Eucharistic adoration and knelt in humility & awe
- I learned about Marian consecration.

That school and community remind me so much of ours and it is what made me want to teach in a Catholic school. My mother's and teacher's heart hurts.

In an effort to process and heal, I looked back at my journal at the time and my first entry written in that church said, "I realized today that the only thing I need to fear is the Lord."

A year later I wrote, "Looking at the crucifix today, I know I can give all of my sufferings to the Lord on the cross."



I can truly say, Annunciation church was a pivotal place in my life where I met our Lord and our Lady. I found a little room there that felt like a treasure chest. Upon arrival, you'd find an armchair facing a beautiful icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help. I'll never forget that feeling when I turned on the lights, it was like Our Lady was shining into all of the dark areas of my life, inviting me to come sit and rest with

Today on the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross, I can take comfort that although it may seem like the enemy won on Good Friday or even on that terrible day in Minneapolis, he didn't. What hope we have in Jesus!

A key phrase in the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Atrium that catechists proclaim every time we light a candle is, "Christ has died, Christ IS risen". We always proclaim His resurrection because while the cross may seem like the end of the story, it isn't. He was victorious over death! His light and love are stronger than the darkness.

The power of the cross is real and my journal entries display that "childlike" faith. It is the littlest ones who often understand that deep truth better than we do. You will almost always see during an atrium session a small child (often a boy) processing with our San Damiano crucifix. This gives me great hope when my mind wanders to the darkness of death. I can picture Our Lady weeping in the pews of Annunciation but I can also see the Good Shepherd slowly lifting up His little children and carrying them to safety. Let us rest in these words of the Gospel today:

"So must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life."

### REFLECT

In 2021, Pope Francis established the celebration of the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. In the U.S., we observe this celebration in September, joining the Church's efforts to highlight the value and importance of grandparents and the elderly in our families and in society.

While the elderly have traditionally held places of honor in various cultures, today, elderly members of our families and communities often live lives marked by isolation and loneliness. Rather than being a beloved and integral part of a family, they are too often forgotten or overlooked. In the most tragic circumstances, some even seek to end their own lives through assisted suicide so as not to be a burden to their loved ones. Pope Francis has described this shift as a "throwaway culture" in which the weakest are neglected or worse when they are no longer of interest or "use."

As persons made in the image and likeness of God, we possess an infinite dignity that can never be compromised by age or ability. This truth must guide each of us in our responsibility to lovingly accompany those who are in greater need of our time,

care, and attention as they face their later years. Such accompaniment is of particular importance as they near the end of their lives, often enduring great sufferings as they prepare for their entrance to eternal life.

May each of us hear and respond to the plea of the elderly entrusted to our care: "Do not cast me aside in my old age; as my strength fails, do not forsake me" (Psalm 71:9).

- Take time this week to call or visit an elderly grandparent, family member, neighbor, or friend.

### Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross

Num 21:4b-9 | Phil 2:6-11 | Jn 3:13-17

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Although God had freed our ancestors in faith from their slavery in Egypt, today we find them grumbling against the Lord as they wander in the desert. Even after we've glimpsed so much of God's goodness, we, too, can begin to grumble in challenging moments of our lives. It's precisely then that we need to cling to faith. After serpents appeared and began to bite those who had grumbled against God, those who had been bitten only had to look at the serpent mounted on a pole and put their faith in God once again to be healed. Similarly, when we find ourselves in the trials of life, we need only look at the cross of Jesus with faith. "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." Amid the storms of our lives, we are called to put our trust in his cross, for through it we are saved and set free.

### GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Paul tells us that God the Father "greatly exalted" Jesus for his humility in embracing the cross, and that ultimately, all creation will join the Father in glorifying Christ. We who know the gift of what Jesus did for us on the cross are called to praise him with our voices and our lives. We praise and glorify Christ first through our example. How might our day-to-day interactions give others a glimpse of the humble and self-emptying love of Jesus? Finally, think of the ways that knowing Christ's love has made a difference in your life. Has it made you more patient? Has it made you more hopeful? Think of ways that you could share this in conversation. Telling others about what God has done for you or the difference that he has made in your life is one way of exalting Christ.

### PRAISE

Today, spend some time thanking and praising God for the gift of the cross and our salvation in Christ. You might wish to use this traditional prayer frequently used during the stations of the cross in Lent: "We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you. Because, by your holy cross, you have redeemed the world."


