

How do we fast?

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Am I excused from fasting and abstinence?

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the **physically** or **mentally ill** including individuals suffering from **chronic illnesses** such as **diabetes**. Also excluded are **pregnant** or **nursing women**.



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

2/22 Ash Wednesday

Why do we receive dust (ashes) on our foreheads to mark the beginning of Lent? Wearing ashes is a way for us to humble ourselves before God and show that we are willing to make a change in our lives. The Church gives us physical reminders (sacramentals) like blessed ashes, palms, candles, holy images, holy water, and crucifixes to help us sanctify daily life. The ashes are really for our benefit because God already knows what is in our hearts. Wearing ashes on our foreheads reminds us to turn our hearts toward God.

Go to Mass together today and observe this day of fasting and abstinence. Talk with your family about what you will "give up" for the forty days of Lent. Sure, you could give up chocolate or soda, but you could also give up video games, snoozing your alarm, or listening to music in the car. Also consider what your family could "take up" during Lent. Pray a morning prayer before you begin your

day, add Eucharistic Adoration or a daily Mass during the week. Add the Stations of the Cross devotion on Fridays. There are many beautiful ways to grow in Faith during Lent. We've also created a Lenten playlist for you - scan the Spotify QR code to listen. >

PRAYER, FASTING, ALMSGIVING

During Lent, we are asked to devote ourselves to seeking the Lord in prayer and reading Scripture, to service by giving alms, and to sacrifice self-control through fasting.

Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season.

In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs."
