



Dear Parish Family,

The dashboard on this page is a summary of our End of Financial Year Accounts. The diocese accounting year runs from July 1st to June 30th, so the year we are looking at ended on June 30th, 2024.

As Fr. Toner told you in the Spring there were a lot of challenges last year. Thanks to your support we weathered the storm but ended up with a total deficit of (\$96,034).

With the help of concerned school parents and our new Finance Committee we have revised the budget process for the parish and school this year. That is why we saw changes in tuition costs for the school and preschool. We have also been looking carefully at our expenditures to ensure that we stay within budget. The Finance Committee anticipates that this year we will meet many of the challenges we have experienced and begin to resolve them.

The other side of our accounts is the Balance Sheet, and it is here that the impact of the last couple of years was really felt. Our total assets fell significantly as we emptied our financial reserves to maintain operations. We also had to borrow money from the diocese to meet our liabilities. Including the capital campaign loan we owe the diocese \$1,100,000.

This is a significant sum but with your support I am confident that we will be able to pay this off over time. We are in

the process of setting up a 10 year loan with the diocese so that we can pay off the loan and interest in a structured way.

We will also need to begin refilling the parish savings account with the money we used to keep things going. Having a reserve to act as a cushion is as important as paying down the debt. I want you to know that we are committed to doing both.

From the Pastor's Desk

Changes for the new Liturgical Year

Dear Parish Family,

Advent is fast approaching, and as we begin a new liturgical year there will be some liturgical changes happening. I want to share these with you now:

1. First, the big six candles will only be lit on Sundays, Holy Days and for School Masses. They will still be on the altar, but at weekday Mass only two candles will be lit. This will allow the "big six" to burn evenly while still honoring the Sacrifice of the Mass with candlelight.



2. Second, incense will continue to be used at one Mass each Sunday or Holy Day. However, it will alternate between the 11:00am Mass and the 5:00pm Mass every other week. This will be highlighted in the bulletin with a thurible icon. This will make it easier for those who have a problem with incense to choose their mass accordingly.

3. Third, we will begin to pray an Angelus for Vocations before every Sunday and Holy Day Mass. The Angelus will be easy to find if you need the words. It is being added to the inside back cover of the St. Michael Hymnal.

In all of the parishes where I have been Pastor, I have introduced the Angelus for Vocations before Mass begins. This does three things:

- It encourages people to turn and greet each other before the Angelus is prayed.
- It reminds us of the importance of living our lives as a vocation in service to Almighty God – whatever that vocation may be. So, we pray not only for discernment to the priesthood and religious life—but also for the single life and those preparing for marriage.
- It acts as a break that brings our hearts and minds back to focusing on God and the awesome mystery that we are about to celebrate. The *silence* before Mass begins is an important part of this (excluding the joyful noises of little ones of course).

I was introduced to this when I was on vacation in Hilton Head many years ago. The local parish where I attended Sunday Mass were doing this and it struck me as a beautiful thing. Not only is it a gentle reminder to our young parishioners that discerning one's vocation is an *important* and *necessary* thing for us as Christians, but it reminds us of the part we all play in helping them in this discernment.

The 1st Lector (Old Testament) will be responsible for leading us in the Angelus, and the cantor will no longer make any announcement after the bell rings because the bell is actually the start of Mass, and we should immediately launch into worship.

I am looking forward to sharing this beautiful ministry with you!



"Do This in Remembrance of Me" A Step-By-Step Walk Through the Mass Fr. Luke Spannagel

+ Part 75: Purification of the Sacred Vessels +

While you are praying after Holy Communion, you have probably noticed that there is still visible action at the altar. This is called the **Purification of the Sacred Vessels**. As the Diocese of Peoria instructs, "After communion, there may be a song of thanksgiving or a moment of silence. Often during this time the priest or deacon purifies the sacred vessels used for Mass, although this is sometimes done after Mass, especially in places that use a large number of vessels for the distribution of Holy Communion. Even this aspect of the Mass is ritualized, as nothing in the Mass is insignificant. The sacred vessels used for the Mass are carefully purified to ensure that any particles of the Hosts are collected into the chalice so as to be consumed. While the priest purifies the Chalice he says quietly, 'What has passed our lips as food, O Lord, may we possess in purity of heart, that what has been given to us in time may be our healing for eternity.' As we believe in the real presence in the smallest particle of the Host or in even a drop of the precious Blood, this period of purification ensures the proper reverence to the Blessed Sacrament" (A Study of the Mass, p. 20).

For me as a priest, purifying the vessels is a very special time of prayer. Of course, I am thinking about how we believe Jesus is truly present in even the smallest particle or even in the smallest drop of remaining Precious Blood. I am thankful for the Lord's generosity and his humility –that he would come to us in such a gentle and veiled way. I will often pray for specific people at the Mass and for everyone there to be strengthened as they get ready to go forth.

Reverencing the Most Precious Gift

In order to show proper reverence for our Lord's presence under the species of bread and wine, the priest is obliged to do what he reasonably can to gather up any fragments of the host and any drops of the Precious Blood and consume them himself. According to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal: "Whenever a fragment of the host adheres to his fingers, especially after the fraction or after the Communion of the faithful, the Priest should wipe his fingers over the paten or, if necessary, wash them. Likewise, he should also gather any fragments that may have fallen outside the paten" (GIRM, 278). After the priest has drunk from the chalice any remaining Precious Blood, he empties the fragments from the paten into the chalice, which is purified with water. The priest then empties the chalice by drinking the water, which contains the fragments of the consecrated host from the paten and any drops of the Precious Blood remaining in the chalice.

The rite of purification might seem like a trivial detail, but it is actually a great way of bolstering our faith in the true presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. To see priests and deacons carefully consuming leftover particles reminds us just how precious the gift of Holy Communion is, as well as reminding us to always treat this gift respectfully–before, during, and after we have received our Lord in Communion.

For Reflection:

- 1. If you have not already done so, devote some of your time of prayer after Communion to observing the purification of the sacred vessels. Unite yourself spiritually with this act of reverence for Christ's presence.
- 2. Reflect on occasions in your life when you have shown reverence for another person's body, such as caring for young children, the sick, or the elderly. Allow these human experiences to deepen your prayer and reverence towards the Real Presence.
