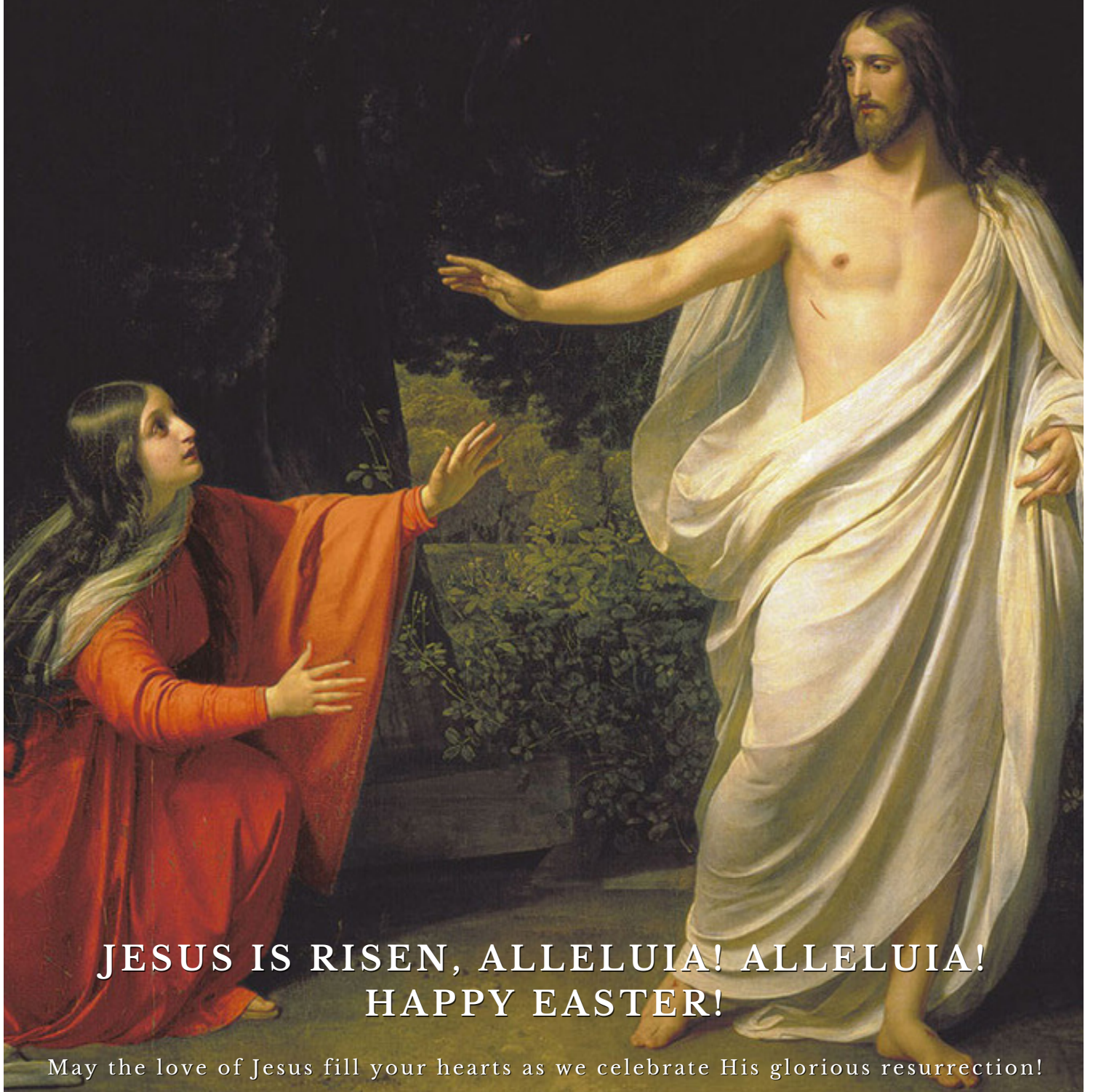

The Resurrection of the Lord

Acts 10:34a, 37-43 | Col 3:1-4 | Jn 20:1-9

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Today we celebrate the Lord's resurrection, the pinnacle of the Church's entire liturgical year. As disciples, we know that Christ's resurrection is not something that happened to him alone; his resurrection offers us the promise that all who believe in him will one day rise with him. But the new life Christ promises is not something we have to wait for the next life to experience! Everything we have been doing throughout Lent to prepare for today's celebration also gives us a foretaste of the fullness of life we will share with him at our own resurrection. By God's grace, we have been inwardly renewed by Lenten prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Our minds and hearts have been lifted from the things of earth to the things of heaven. As disciples of the risen Christ, let us continue to "seek what is above," deepening our own participation here and now in the life he won for us through his cross and glorious resurrection.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

The scene in today's Gospel offers us a helpful insight for evangelization. Peter and John run to the empty tomb. While John gets there faster, he waits outside and allows Peter to enter first. We can think of Peter as symbolic of faith (he is the one, after all, who confesses Jesus as the Christ (Mt.16:16)), and John, as symbolic of love (in our Gospel, John is referred to not by name, but as "the other disciple whom Jesus loved.") Although Peter and John see the empty tomb and believe, our Gospel reading ends with this interesting detail: "For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead." I think what the text is showing us is that *love* and *faith* often precede *understanding*. In our efforts of evangelization, apologetics and theology have their place. But we must not forget that sometimes inviting someone to love and trust in the Lord - before they have all the answers worked out - is more effective than trying to help a person reason their way to faith by perfect explanations. Love and faith draw us to encounter the risen Lord, and understanding comes later.

CELEBRATE

"This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad" our psalm tells us. Today is the Solemnity of solemnities, the Feast of all feasts! Take some time to rejoice and give thanks for all that God has done for us through his death and glorious resurrection. Today nothing else should be on our "to do" list other than to celebrate well!

From Panic to Promise

Dear Parish Family,

Christ is Risen! Alleluia! One of the Gospel readings for this Easter Sunday has Mary Magdalene going to the tomb and finding it empty. The stone has been removed and she panics. Running back to the Upper Room she fetches Simon Peter and John. They also panic. They also run to the tomb, sprinting to see who gets there first, to see the stone rolled back and the tomb empty.

In that moment they could have scattered, blinded by their grief and fear, but that doesn't happen. Instead, Peter enters the tomb, and John's gospel tells us that John himself, "the one who had arrived at the tomb first... saw and believed". They still didn't have all the facts, they had not yet seen the Risen Lord, they did not fully understand what this meant - that Jesus had risen from the dead - but John believed. And, from that simple act of belief, comes his desire, many years later, to write his gospel - so that ALL may believe that Jesus is the Son of God, the Risen Lord, who has conquered sin and death for us.



Like the first disciples, we too can be blinded by our ignorance of Scripture, or the confusion of the times in which we live. We see the fractured world in which we live and long for a kind of Utopia here on earth that we cannot achieve. The Prince of Peace does not promise earthly peace in our times; His peace is an everlasting peace in the world that is to come. It is the hope of resurrected life, communion with God forever, and the restoration of God's people. In our own panic and fear we often forget this - we want what God offers us NOW and are impatient to grasp it. But that is not how God works in our world. He comes to us in the Incarnation, a frail child and anchors Himself to our humanity. He lives among us sharing the truth of His Gospel and upending those false beliefs that have caused fear and panic for so long, and He shows us the way to the Father's house and leads us there by the sacrifice of the Cross.

So, the next time that fear and panic set in to your heart look to Jesus, the Risen Lord. He is your peace and your hope, He is your future and your past, because you have been baptized into His death and resurrection and now share His life. He is anchored to your life, here and now, and you are anchored to His in a beautiful way. You are not alone. We are not alone. Christ is alive and He is with us! Christ has conquered fear and doubt and invites us now to live for Him and to share His life with the world.

He is risen indeed! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

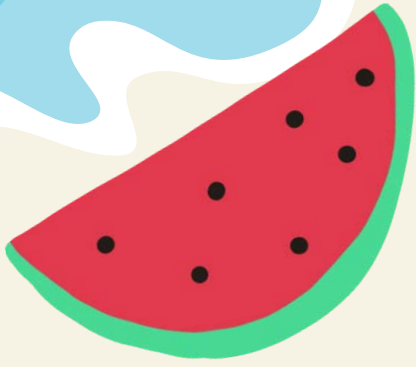

A NOTE ON PARISH MEMBERSHIP AND THE IMPORTANCE OF BEING REGISTERED

The word parish comes to us from the Jews and references a particular group of pilgrim people. The Church now uses it to denote a particular church community in a diocese, on pilgrimage to the Heavenly Jerusalem. This local parish community is under the care of a pastor who is under the authority of the local bishop. This provides for the mission of the Church - the care and sanctification of the faithful at the parish church and the church's outreach of evangelization and works of mercy in the local area.

By registering at a parish, you are declaring your desire to be part of a Catholic faith community. If you have recently moved to the area or have been worshipping with us for a while, but haven't registered in the parish, please do so soon. Additionally, sometime after a young adult turns 18 and has stability in this (or another) community, he/she should register in the local parish church.

Parish Registration is not a passive process. You may be surprised to learn that if you were married here, if your child attends St. Catharine School, or if you grew up at St. Catharine, for example, you are not automatically registered once you become an adult.

Why should you register at St. Catharine or another Catholic Parish?

- A sense of belonging and identity in a parish community
- It is a commitment to practice your faith
- Registration enables the parish pastor and staff to get to know you better, to welcome you and to better minister to you. This is especially important during a time of sacramental preparation for a child, a time of engagement toward preparing for matrimony, or a pastoral crisis of an illness or death.
- Registration helps you stay connected with your parish and helps your parish stay connected with you. Providing your contact information is important so that parishes provide you with timely updates via email, direct mail, phone, etc. Once you are registered, please notify the parish office of any changes in address or phone number!
- Accurate Census numbers can help aid local parish care and programs within the diocese.

How to Obtain the Unique Plenary Indulgence Jesus Offers on Divine Mercy Sunday

1. Go to Confession (20 days before, on, or after Divine Mercy Sunday)
2. Receive Holy Communion (20 days before, on, or after Divine Mercy Sunday)
3. Pray for the Pope
4. In any church or chapel, recite an Our Father, Creed, and a prayer to the Merciful Jesus (i.e., "Merciful Jesus, I trust in You!") in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, or, participate in services honoring the Divine Mercy devotion.

One must approach the indulgence with a spirit "completely detached from the affection for a sin," both mortal and venial. The Church also allows the ill or those who cannot attend church to obtain this indulgence. One may fulfill the three usual conditions as described above as soon as possible, along with reciting an Our Father, Creed, and prayer to the Merciful Jesus.
