



#### From the Pastor's Desk



Dear Parish Family,

It has been an eventful summer for me but I am happy to say that I am gradually settling into things here and am so glad to be part of our parish family. Bentley is also settling in but perhaps not quite as quickly, as he keeps popping back to St. Brendan when I am away! The poor dog is probably very confused! :)

This weekend marks an important point on our journey of faith together. Bishop Fernandes is here to formally install me as Pastor. This liturgical moment is an affirmation of the call that we receive as priests to be attached to a particular place and ministry in service to the Gospel, and the responsibilities that come with that. In my case that is one parish and three ministries but they all complement each other and I want you to know that you are as important to me as the other ministries are. Although our diocese is blessed with a great growth in vocations that does not translate immediately to priests in parishes and our priests are all doing our bit to meet the pastoral needs of God's people. Knowing that we have five vocations from our parish discerning the priesthood is a great blessing for all of us but we must continue to press forward and encourage other young men to ask themselves the question: Is God calling me to be a priest in his Church?

Evangelization is also a top priority for us. We are called to go out and bring others the Good News that we have received and that can only happen when we are willing to lay down our own lives in service to the Gospel. That is not always easy or comfortable but it brings great fruit when we are willing to do so. In the coming months we hope to develop a more robust road map of what that means for us here at St. Catharine. The old "this is MY parish" mentality no longer works anywhere and we have to begin to see our parish as a lamp set on a hill welcoming all those who discover that they are lost to the darkness of our age. A lamp that is welcoming and embraces them as Jesus calls them home to his Church.

For this to flourish we need to have a solid bedrock on which to build. Administration, finances and policies are never the fun part of parish life but they are important if we are to build the strong foundations that will empower our work of ministry. In October we will begin publishing a monthly financial dashboard that will help us be transparent with you about the health of our parish and what our blessings and challenges are. Then, together, we can do the important work that needs to be done.

None of this should worry us. As Mother Teresa reminds: "Yesterday is gone, tomorrow has not yet come, we have only today. Let us begin."

A St. Catharine Parishioner, Paul T. Mascia is a graduate of Yale University, where his senior thesis was an in-depth analysis of the reformer and Medieval mystic, St. Catharine of Siena. Paul and his wife, Theresa, reside in Columbus and have five adult children and seven grandchildren. Nazar's Journey is Mr. Mascia's first novel, and his first piece of historical fiction.

# "Do This in Remembrance of Me" A Step-By-Step Walk Through the Mass

Part 67: The Showing of the Host



"Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." After his genuflection to Our Lord really present in the Most Holy Eucharist, the priest raises the chalice with the host and proclaims these words of St. John the Baptist (Jn 1:29). This part of the Mass is called the "Showing of the Host."

The current General Instruction of the Roman Missal includes a paragraph on this part of the Mass: "Then the Priest shows the faithful the Eucharistic Bread, holding it over the paten or over the chalice, and invites them to the banquet of Christ; and along with the faithful, he then makes an act of humility, using the prescribed words from the Gospels" (GIRM, 84). There is really a communication going on here. Like St. John the Baptist, the priest is proclaiming the presence of the Lord Jesus and pointing him out so that everyone may know he is with us. Then the priest extends an invitation to those who are able to partake in this special gift, the Holy Eucharist.

#### An Invitation and a Gift

"Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." As Edward Sri indicates, "these words are taken from a climactic moment in the book of Revelation and indeed, the entire Bible (Rv 19:9)." The scene is set as the great multitude in heaven is singing together the Lord's praises. Sri continues, "And the angel instructs John to write: 'Blessed are those who are invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb' (Rv 19:9). What is the festive supper of the Lamb? It is the Lord's Supper, the Eucharist. First of all, the supper and the Lamb bring to mind the Passover supper in which Jew's would sacrifice a lamb and eat of it as the main course of the meal... But this passage tells us something even more dramatic. In Revelation 19:6-9, the Lamb is revealed to be a bridegroom! And that means this Passover supper is a wedding feast. The Bridegroom-Lamb is Jesus, and the Bride represents us, the Church, whom Jesus is coming to wed... When you hear those words at Mass, do you realize that you are receiving a wedding invitation? You are being called to participate in the marriage feast of Jesus and his Church" (A Biblical Walk Through the Mass, pp. 138, 140).

We are so blessed by his invitation and the gift of Jesus himself. What do we do now? The only right thing to do is to be honest with the Lord about his generosity and recognize that without his grace and mercy, we could never be worthy of such a gift. Thankfully for us, the words of the centurion from the Gospel (see Mt 8:8) summarize well what our response should be. After the showing and "Lamb of God," the priest and the people respond, "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed."

**Our Response and Reception** 

As the Diocese of Peoria teaches, "We respond to this invitation of the priest to receive the Lord Jesus in the Holy Eucharist with humility. Like the centurion servant who recognized himself unworthy to have the Lord 'under his roof' to heal his child, it calls to mind our humility-and the Lord's divine majesty that He can do this work despite our weaknesses" (A Study of the Mass, p. 19). As Edward Sri notes, these words of the centurion are also a prayer that "expresses a great faith that surpasses many others in the gospels and amazes even Jesus: he believes Jesus can heal from afar, simply by speaking his word... Jesus praises this man for his faith. Just like the centurion, we recognize our unworthiness to have Jesus come under the 'roof' of our souls in holy communion. Yet just as the centurion believed Jesus was able to heal his servant, so do we trust that Jesus can heal us as he becomes the most intimate guest of our soul in the Eucharist" (A Biblical Walk Through the Mass, p. 142).

The Diocese of Peoria reminds us: "it is for this reason that Jesus came into the world, as 'people who are well do not need doctors, sick people do!' 'I have come to seek out those who are lost!' In the Holy Eucharist, Jesus seeks us out! He comes to our doors and He knocks. Our reception of Communion is an opportunity to allow Him into our hearts..." (A Study of the Mass, p. 19).

The Lord Jesus, of course, knows our failings. That he wants us anyway is what makes his love so powerful and so amazing. That he would offer his very Body to us is even more amazing. It is natural for us to desire to repay a kindness, but what do we do when the kindness is the greatest gift in the history of the world? Thankfully, the rest of the Mass will help us to know what to do!

#### For Reflection:

- 1. Pray with the account of Jesus healing the centurion's servant in Mt 8:5-13. If desired, extend your meditation to include the accounts of other healings and miracles in the rest of this chapter. Reflect on your own identification and/or connection with one or more of the persons who encounter Jesus, and ask for the healing you need at this time.
- 2. Reflect on what may be blocking the door of your heart or obstructing the Lord Jesus' entrance. Make it a point to receive the Sacrament of Penance to prepare yourself to welcome Jesus more freely and fully in Holy Communion.

#### Faithful Citizenship: Subsidiarity

In Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, the Catholic bishops of the U.S. identify the four main principles of the Church's social teaching—Dignity of the Human Person, the Common Good, Solidarity, and Subsidiarity—and apply them to concrete issues. This entry focuses on Subsidiarity.



Subsidiarity is a principle that larger institutions (such as the state or federal government) should not overwhelm or interfere with smaller or local institutions (such as the family, local schools, or the Church community). And, when local entities cannot uphold human dignity, meet human needs, or advance the common good, larger entities have responsibilities to ensure all people can thrive.

Respecting this principle promotes the flourishing of each person and the realization of the common good. By participating in public life locally, each person and civil society can enrich their neighbors, communities, and society through:

- Defending and strengthening marriage between a man and a woman as the most fundamental unit of society and a sanctuary for creating and nurturing children.<sup>2</sup>
- Upholding parents' rights and responsibilities in directing their children's education in accordance with their convictions, with support rather than interference from the state.<sup>3</sup>
- Strengthening family stability with laws and policies to support parents, including childcare, healthcare, housing assistance, and child tax credits.<sup>4</sup>
- Advocating for economic policies that provide jobs with decent working conditions, fair wages, and protect workers' rights to organize and bargain collectively.<sup>5</sup>

As we pursue the principle of Subsidiarity in our public policies, we pray for all families and those in poverty and support their efforts to exercise their rights and responsibilities in society.




